### From the Pastor's Desk by Pastor Maxwell Whitehead

As of December 3, 2023, we will be in the season of Advent. The church will be decorated in blue, the halls will be decked with boughs of holly (more or less), the Christmas tree will be up, and

we will finally get to start singing some Christmas songs! Plus Thanksgiving is over, so Christmas songs can rightly be played on the radio.

Since it is the season of Advent. we all know that Christmas is the end of Advent. It is time for a couple annual reminders:

- 1. Advent is the time of preparation.
- 2. Christmas comes whether you are prepared or not.

3. From Titus 3:5, "3:5 he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done. but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit."

Advent is absolutely a season for preparation. But let us not get too caught up in our ability - or lack thereof - to be prepared. Each year people talk about the "true meaning of Christmas." This is all right and good, the true meaning of Christmas must be talked about and we must be reminded of it. However, this also

Titus 3:4-7

Do all the presents need to be wrapped. the stockings neatly hung, the family time specifically planned out? Maybe that's what your friends and family need. Let me tell you what your soul and God needs:

Jesus Christ was sent for you. God knows full well who you are. He sees you when you're sleeping, He knows when you're awake. He knows if you've

been bad or good... STOP! Stop singing the song right there. The rest can be about Santa. God knows your whole being and sent His only Son for you anyways. Know that He has poured out His Spirit upon you through His Son.

If you know this, believe this, trust this, you are perfectly prepared this Advent season. May all this bring you tidings of comfort and joy.

This is most certainly true.

Kayla Mehlhaf has put on a Christmas concert at Our Savior's Kayla's Lutheran Church for many years, and she is back again



### Confirmation: Diving Deeper into the Word and Lutheran Theology

A new season of Confirmation has begun! On Sunday, October 29, 2023, 5 young adults were confirmed: 4 from Our Savior's Lutheran and 1 from Spring Valley Lutheran. These 5 have shown that they do have a working knowledge of what it means to be a Christian and even more specifically - a Lutheran. However, this means that they are moving on from our Confirmation group! It is great for them, but the dynamics have now shifted with only 8 kids learning on Wednesday evenings.

As I said, we have entered into a new Confirmation season. Even though we dropped to 8 kids, 3 of which are 7th graders, the conversation is getting deeper and more lively each week. We have started back at the beginning pages of Luther's Small Catechism - the 10 Commandments. Not only are they learning them, but they are learning the meaning and Scripture references behind those meanings! To reinforce this learning,

we are working on their memories. If you know any of the Confirmation students, feel free to ask them what one of the Commandments are AND what it means. In the month we have hit the first 3 Commandments.

All are invited!

Each week the students are also being fed by you, the people of Viborg Lutheran. It has been awesome to see congregation members so willing to prepare and serve food for these young people! Not only does it help me, but it helps form little relationships and connections between members of the congregation and the Confirmation students. Thank you for your continued support of these kids! We have a lot of fun together and are working to continue growing in our understanding of Lutheran Theology, God's Word, and our relationships with one another.

## Jr VCIS: A Ministry of the Younger Viborg Lutheran Church

Time for some stats! In the last 2 months, we have seen a slight growth in children attending JrVCIS. If every child showed up that has been there, we would have a whopping 13 kids! 13 may not sound like a lot, but last year we were usually sitting around 6, maybe 7 if we were lucky. I also know of 3 more children that will be joining our ranks starting this month as well meaning we could hit maxes of 16 kids showing up to spend time together in fellowship, service, and Scripture on Wednesday afternoons!

Over the past 2 months we have talked about the fruits of the Spirit and a verse from 1 Tim: "12 Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity (1 Tim. 4:12)." We have had some (mostly) great discussion over seeing fruits of the Spirit and which ones we bear as well as how we can all be examples for other believers! As far as service goes, we spent one Wednesday raking a neighbor's yard, and then a couple other weeks prepping and painting the shed by Our Savior's Parish Hall. The shed gets used a lot now by the Youth of Viborg Lutheran, so we gave it a little facelift. The kids had a lot of fun painting the shed - and also themselves a little bit...

A reminder to all reading this: This is not a program just for Our Savior's Lutheran kids. All

kids from grades 1-6 are welcome to join us after school at the Parish Hall! Right now the group is primarily comprised of 9 children from Our Savior's and 4 that are not affiliated with either OSLC or Spring Valley Lutheran.

A big thanks needs to be given to Belinda Holm! She is there weekly to feed the kids and help wrangle them when necessary. Keeping 13 kids in that large age range can be a difficult task to an untrained, childless man like myself, but Belinda is very instrumental in making sure the chaos does not completely break down into anarchy. I'm happy to say that we will have another volunteer coming in starting next month as well as our group continues to grow and have a need for another set of adult eyes. We do not have a specific fund for these kiddos, and we do feed them a little snack every week. If vou would like to provide a snack for them, that would be greatly appreciated! Please reach out to me or Belinda Holm or Mindy Spangler if you know of a Wednesday afternoon that you would like to serve the up and coming elementary kids of our congregations.

## VCIS: A Ministry of the larger Viborg Lutheran Church

The season of Advent is upon us! Do you know what that means for the VCIS? Caroling! We started it last year and will continue this year. Here's how it works: Instead of people donating for us to plant a flock of 15-30 flamingos in an unsuspecting victim's yard, we will now surprise people with carols and a little goodie basket! If you would like to send the VCIS Carolers to someone's front door, just let Pastor Max know. Similar to the flamingos, we ask for a \$30 donation before we hit the streets. Last year, we caroled to 16 different homes!

We will also be bringing back our 2nd Annual Parade of Homes! This is an event where you can come to the Parish Hall, donate \$10, and we will give you a wristband and a map of 5-10 hosts that have graciously opened up their largely decorated homes for you to go see! Last year we had 6 homes on the list, 62 guests, and had \$620 donated for our Mission

program. Not only did we raise a good chunk of change, all the guests and hosts really enjoyed themselves!

We will be continuing to Dive into the Word as the year wraps up. I have a new plan to roll out January 23 as well: PARABLES! There are about 30 parables in the Gospels, so we will choose one each week and dissect it to discover what it means for us in 2024.

We are very grateful for the time and space that we have to gather together! We are grateful for the opportunity to serve, play, and learn. If you would like to help support this group, food on Wednesday is always appreciated as well as financial support. If food or finances are ways that you would like to help out, let me know!
